Reflections on Riverside Elementary School

In September, 1948 Jim Klan moved into the Riverside Elementary School district. What follows are his reminiscences of the school and the times that, hopefully, will bring back memories for each of us, from our own era in grade school. Enjoy!

I transferred to Riverside at the start of my fourth grade year. We moved from North Union Ave. (North Lincoln district) to our little farm on Gaskill while I was still in the third grade.

I met so many good people in grade school who have become my lifelong friends. My first class at Riverside was about half fourth graders and half fifth. Ms. Zeigler was the teacher. I use Ms. because I don't know if she was married or not. She was a lot of fun and a good teacher.

A real sad thought when I look at some of those grade school pictures, two students never returned to school after the fourth grade. They were taken by polio shortly after the picture was taken: Linda Barnard and Benny Stern. I remember Linda as being one of the smarter kids in the class. She also played the violin, quite well for a fourth grader. I remember Benny, mostly talking baseball. The Cleveland Indians had just won the World Series and Benny convinced me that Larry Doby was our favorite player. Did I say the Indians won the World Series? Wow, that was a long time ago.

Our parents sure had to be burdened with a great worry every summer during polio season. During the summer we were not supposed to get over exerted, get sweaty, swim in the river, or swim anywhere at certain times. Of course you cannot hold back a bunch of healthy, fun loving boys. Heck, we never paid much attention to that stuff. Two of the special favorites of all the kids at Riverside were Mr. Sadler, the custodian, and Miss Inky, the full time school nurse (I think I have spelled the names correctly!). Mr. Sadler used to play John Phillip Sousa marches as we went to recess. Those records were played on Mr. Sadler's old hand crank type record player. The kids, especially the younger ones, would be marching to the sound of the music.

The guys in the north end always had a standard joke, even after we had grown to adulthood, whenever anyone would get cut or injured, no matter how minor, "Hmmm, that looks bad. You better get down and see Miss Inky."

During my fifth grade year we started out with a teacher Miss Lower, but she became ill during the year and was replaced by Mrs. O'Donnell. She was the wife of the high school band director (Vance O'Donnell). I spent a lot of time while in Miss Lower's class sitting all alone in the hall. I occupied that seat for about six full weeks, I think. The only kid I remember who was assigned this special seat was my friend Butch Nile. No wonder me and Butch are such good friends. The hall seating was how teachers 'controlled' over active boys in those days.

When Mrs. O'Donnell took over the class, she brought me back into the classroom. This was somewhat based on my promise not to clown around too much. She was one of my favorite teachers.

I usually walked to school with Ron and Bob Morgan. The boy holding the dog in one of our class pictures is Bob Morgan. Bob's dog, Lady, followed us to school. We figured the teacher would just send us to take the dog home and not count us as late. But it was picture day, and our class was scheduled early in the morning, so Lady stayed and got in our fifth grade class picture.

Recess! The best part of the day! I remember choosing up sides to play softball. It wasn't so bad when

the older boys like Ron Morgan and Herb Trainer were picked before me. But Joyce Tulle was always picked before me. I must admit, she deserved it. Sports for girls were not around much. Joyce was a good basketball player too. She would have been material for an athletic scholarship in this day and age. Joyce has passed on, but I remember kidding her about those days at recess at one of our class reunions.

During the sixth grade, Mr. Lutz was my teacher, at least part of the time. He was also principal and shared teaching duties. I think he was also principal at North Lincoln, maybe both schools at once.

I can't remember the woman teacher who shared our class, but I do remember her punishing Ken Woodall and June Funk for talking too much. They had to sit together at the same desk for the rest of the afternoon. That was the worst thing that could happen to a sixth grade boy. I never saw two faces so red, for so long.

I met so many good friends at Riverside. It was a sad day when Riverside School closed, and was later torn down. Riverside School, Earley's Hill, Stanley Pool... These

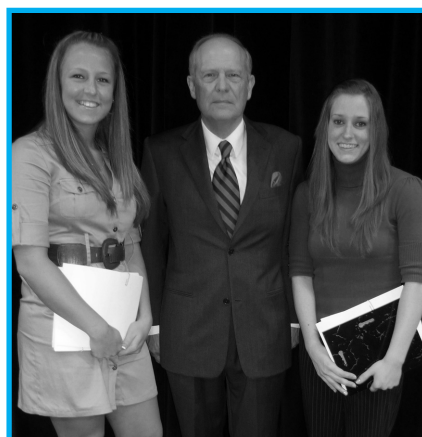
