Furcolows Establish Football Scholarship Endowment

The Francis G. Furcolow and Esther M. Williams Furcolow Football Scholarship

In the halls of Alliance High School certain names seem to evoke memories of athletic excellence and tradition. One name that immediately inspires an AHS graduate to reminisce about athletic and football excellence is "Furcolow". The Furcolow name in Alliance goes back to the late 1800's. Michael Furcolow, judge and attorney, father of Francis Furcolow, started the Christopher Columbus Society. He stressed academic and athletic performance. Michael had one of first tennis courts in Alliance at his residence located on Oxford Street for the family and neighbors to enjoy.

Two New Scholarships Added To The AHS Foundation's Family of Awards

The local Chapter is named in honor of Thomas A Mangino '62, who has been 'Missing In Action' near Chu Lai, Quang Ngai Province, South Vietnam since 21 April 1967.

A scholarship will be awarded annually to an AHS graduate who is planning to attend college or technical training. In addition, criteria for selection will include community involvement, participation in school activities and teacher recommendations. A copy of the military Honorable Discharge (DD 214) for the veteran must accompany the application along with a description of the student's relationship to the veteran.

Francis's older brother, Leo, the first Italian American to graduate from Mount Union College, went on to Cornell University, where he graduated second in his class in medicine. Dr. Leo Furcolow '25 worked with Dr. Jonas Salk on the Polio Vaccine. He also directed the administration of the medical school at the University of Kansas.

The oldest brother, Lawrence (Paul) Furcolow '23, attended West Point Military Academy. He was an officer on the Hindenburg during its flight back to Germany before its fatal return to the United States in May of 1937.

Dr. James P. Furcolow '61, son of Francis Furcolow '31, brother of David Furcolow '55 and Edward Furcolow '60, has chosen to remember his family with a scholarship to be presented annually to an AHS football player, who exemplifies the football tradition the Furcolow family has perpetuated at Alliance High. The scholarship will be presented to a graduating senior football player who will pursue his education beyond high school.

Francis (Fran) Furcolow '31 was a four year starter and letterman for the Aviators from 1927 to 1930 playing both offense and defense as a lineman. He also played with the Minerva Merchants, a semi-pro team that went undefeated for many years.



Vietnam Veterans of America Chapter 157, Alliance, Ohio

"Never again will one generation of Veterans abandon another"



The Vietnam era erupted in violence and ended in silence. There were no welcome home parades. No one mentioned the war. It was not discussed out loud, nor was its history taught in our schools. Therefore the stories of valor and sacrifice may well perish with its veterans.

After living through years of indifference, we are now compelled to ensure that our history is preserved. We believe that the Vietnam Veterans of America, Thomas A Mangino Chapter 157 of Alliance, through the Alliance High School Foundation and this Scholarship, will provide assurance that our stories are told. Our sacrifices will be seen as a legacy preserved for generations to come.

In honor of all Vietnam veterans of America, Chapter 157 is transferring more than \$20,000.00 to establish an annual scholarship for an Alliance High School graduate. In doing so, we fulfill our promise that the public is made aware of Vietnam Veterans sacrifices and to honor with dignity the men and women who served our country. As the last Vietnam veteran is buried, the flag is folded and taps is played, Chapter 157's scholarship will be there for future students, ensuring that these veterans will never be forgotten.

Chapter 157, Vietnam Veterans in Alliance, Ohio, was founded in September 1985 with sixty-three charter members. In 1992 the Chapter's charter was renamed Thomas A Mangino, Chapter 157. Thomas A Mangino, husband of the late Connie Rhoads Mangino and son of the late Angelo and Helen Micketti Mangino, was born in Alliance. He graduated from Alliance High School in 1962. Staff Sgt Mangino was, and is, listed as 'Missing in Action,' 21 April 1967, an infantryman with Company D, 4th Battalion, 31st Infantry Regiment, 196th Light Infantry Brigade, Task Force Oregon while on combat patrol in Chu Lai, Quang Ngai Province, South Vietnam.

The Chapter continues its efforts of 'In Service to America,' and to the community surrounding Alliance. Its Color Guard has participated in countless parades, festivals and other civic activities over the years. The Color Guard continues a tradition of more than fifty years of veterans presenting the flag at all AHS home football games. Chapter 157 has continued this tradition for more than twenty years. Vietnam Veterans of America Chapter 157 performs 'Honor Guard' duties for Veterans funerals per family requests.

The Chapter has been a sponsor of the Carnation Festival since 1991. With the proceeds from its beverage booth at the Rib Burn-Off, it has provided over \$15,000.00 in scholarships to local students and makes annual donations to the Salvation Army, Alliance Domestic Violence Shelter and the Alliance Community Pantry.

John R Walker '64 Writes Book

Last summer, after many years of preparation, John Walker '64 saw his dream come to fruition. His book, Bracketing the Enemy: Forward Observers in World War II (ISBN: 9780806143804) was published. (Available through University of Oklahoma Press (OUPress.com or 800-627-7377)

After World War II, General George Patton declared that artillery had won the war. While no single combat arm won the war alone, crucial to the success of field artillery were forward observers, artillerymen on the front lines who directed artillery fire.

Using the 37th Division, Ohio National Guard in the Pacific Theater and the 87th in Europe as case studies, Walker presents a vivid picture of the dangers involved in Forward Observer duty and the contributions they made to the success of ground operations.


Many members of the Alliance National Guard unit, Battery C, 135th Field Artillery, 37th Division which is widely mentioned in the book were Alliance High School graduates, including Lt Donald L Walker, class of 1938, father of the author, who trained with Battery C from 1938-1941 but ultimately served with the 87th Division in Europe..

With the idea of a book driving his interest from the start, John worked on his Ph.D. in History at Kent State University, preparing his doctoral dissertation on the evolution of forward observation and forward observers in combat.

John writes that many former members of the AHS marching band in the 1960s will remember long hours of practice on the field behind the Armory on Vine Street. They were practicing on the same ground where their fathers trained prior to their combat service in the Pacific in World War II.

John and his wife, Alice, live in Stow Ohio and have been married for 42 years. They have two sons, a daughter and three grandchildren.

Donald L Walker '38 trained with Battery C until his separation in 1941. He was recalled to active duty

fifty-one weeks later and went to Europe with the 87th Division as an enlisted man. In Europe he served with A Battery, 334th Field Artillery Battalion as part of a three man forward observer party. Forward Observer casualties mounted and Don became team leader for a forward observer crew. He earned a Bronze Star (Heroic Action) and a Silver Star (Gallantry in Action) and received a battlefield commission on April 30, 1945.

After the war, Don returned to Transue & Williams, where he had started in 1942 before being recalled to active service, working as a Cost Estimator, he retired in 1982. In 1946 he and his new family moved to Burt Avenue in Alliance where he lived until his death on June 15, 1990.

With a love for the land, Fran continued farming as a hobby for the rest of his life.

David Furcolow `55 was a punter and linebacker for the Aviators from 1952 to 1954, contributing to some of the finest teams in Alliance football history. After attending Kent State University, he joined the U.S. Army, where he served honorably. After his active military service Dave became a construction electrician working out of the Canton Local on jobs all over Stark County. He completed over thirty-five years in the Army reserves, retiring as a Command Sgt Major. Dave volunteered as head football coach at St Joseph and Regina Coeli for over twenty-five years and later volunteered as an assistant football coach at Marlington and Alliance middle schools. Dave is survived by his wife,

Sandy Yendrich Furcolow '59, and their two children, Michael and Matthew, and ex-wife, Marty Donohue Furcolow Egan, and their two children, David Jr. '78, and Michelle Furcolow Kelleher '79.

Edward F. (Ed) Furcolow '60 was the starting center on the 1958 Alliance State Championship team. Like his father, he played both offense and defense for three years, 1957, '58 and '59. After graduating from AHS, he attended Ohio University, starting as the varsity center when the Bobcats went undefeated (10-0), winning the Mid-American Conference championship. After attending college, Ed joined the U.S. Army. He attended officer candidate school and was commissioned as a First Lieutenant. He played semi-pro football for the Canton Bulldogs before the team relocated to Pennsylvania. Ed was also a construction electrician in the Canton local. He is survived by his wife, Carolyn, and ex-wife, Janice Patrick Furcolow Valentine '60 and their three children, Lisa Furcolow Thompson, Lynette Furcolow Guthrie and Edward P. Furcolow.

Alliance High School Distinguished Alumni

The Alliance High School Distinguished Alumni Selection Committee was established in 1966, under the chairmanship of Clarence Steffy, to recognize Alliance High School graduates who have made outstanding contributions to society on a local, state, national or international basis. Criteria for selection are established that the individual must be an AHS graduate, must have graduated at least five years prior to selection and may be living or deceased. Accomplishments must be so outstanding that there is no question of his or her qualifications for selection.

Including the initial selection of fourteen 'Distinguished Alumni' in 1967, a total of 92 AHS graduates have been honored as 'Distinguished Alumni.'

The selection committee has implemented a plan of honoring a Distinguished Alumni Class every fourth year, but nominations are continually being sought and accepted. The nomination form is available on the Alliance City

Schools website: www.alliancecityschools.org, select Alliance High School and click on Alumni.

Many of these Distinguished Alumni were selected prior to the reestablishment of the AHS Foundation and the publishing of this newsletter. In this and ensuing issues, we will share some of the achievements that qualified those graduates who have been honored as Alliance High School Distinguished Alumni.

A charter member, inducted in 1967, Dr. Charles Armstrong, AHS class of 1905. Dr. Armstrong went on to graduate from Mount Union College and Johns Hopkins Medical School. He was a pioneer doctor and outstanding laboratory physician whose efforts helped cure thousands with polio, ricketts, botulism and typhus. He served as a World War I Naval surgeon and later as Chief of the National Institutes of Health in the Infectious Diseases Division. After 50 years of service, Dr Armstrong was honored by President Lyndon B Johnson for "important contributions to the medical advances of time."
