

James Ballor 'Fac, age 69, passed away on March 27, 2022. Famous for "running with the bulls" in Pamplona, Spain, Jim was loved and respected by generations of students at AHS. He leaves behind his wife Christine Thomas Ballor '73. 2022 AHS ACADEMIC TOP TEN PERCENT Recognition moves from Dinner to Dessert

As a direct result of COVID-19, in 2021, the decision was made to conduct the Top 10% dinner, typically held at the University of Mount Union which had limited the number of outside events on the campus due to the pandemic, to a dessert event in the gymnasium at AHS. The high school administration worked closely with the Top 10% planning committee to cut down on the amount of time allotted for the event and meet the social distancing requirements. The idea of a dessert was born.

The 2021 results were very positive, as some other changes to the format were incorporated. A guest speaker who is a graduate of the high school was still scheduled, and the event was limited to fewer outside guests. In addition, award winners, who were always asked to provide a written reason they chose their honored educator, were now asked to read them to the audience. The response by students, parents and staff was very positive.

In 2022, the committee decided to keep the dessert format, and was moved back to the Hoover Price Campus Center at Mount Union. The event continues to be a formal, celebratory affair, recognizing the

academic achievements of those in the top ten percent of the graduating class at Alliance High School. This year's speaker was Scott Rowley, Class of 2002. During his time at AHS, Scott was a top scholar and was very involved in the band, choir, and musical theatre programs.

The building on Glamorgan, 'behind the castle' was built in 1972. Here we are fifty years later and we still refer to this building as "the new high school." The story is told that the only two things that were brought from the Broadway and Arch building were: The Murals that were painted by seniors Jack Stanley and Charles Gehm of the class of 1948 (They used classmates and other students as models in many cases.) and the chandelier that was the class gift from the Class of 1915.

The murals hang at the back of the auditorium, facing the stage and the chandelier still lights the stairway leading to the cafeteria area in the basement. A recognition and celebration of 50 years is being considered.

Farmers Market Moves to Union Ave and State St

Alliance's Farmers Market is operating from the corner of Union Ave. and State St. for the summer of 2022. The 'One Book-One Community' program sparked the beginning of the Farmers Market more than ten years ago when the book chosen was 'The 100 Mile Diet' which encouraged local people to eat food grown, hatched, prepared, etc. near their home. The Farmers Market has been located at the 'Caboose Lot' on Main St, the Buckeye Village parking lot on State St and now this, the first year, at Union Ave and State St. where local venders bring their fresh products.

Mount Union Dedicates Larry Kehres Stadium

Mount Union Stadium was renamed Kehres Stadium in dedication ceremonies on the campus of the University of Mount Union on June 11, 2022. Larry Kehres was head coach of the Purple Raider football team for 27 years from 1986 to 2012. His teams won 11 national championships and he is a member of the College Football Hall of Fame.

The former Hartshorn Stadium, Mount Union Stadium and now Kehres Statium is Ohio's oldest college football stadium.

Carnation Mall on West State Street Will be Demolished

Maybe the 'Mall,' which opened in 1983, is demolished by the time you are reading this newsletter. It has been in the planning stages for at least six years, but based on the number of stores 'gone' and the condition of the parking lot; the reality seems to be upon us. Cinemark Carnation Cinema 5 has announced the movie theatre will close August 29, 2022. All that will remain will be the former J C Penney store (to be occupied by Dunham's Sports) and the hotel. A new Meijer Store building will stand alone, with a 3-5 retail store 'strip mall' between Meijer and Dunham's. Meijer plans to build and occupy their building before the 2023 Christmas season.
